From The Director's Desk

I am pleased to place ANSISS Annual Report for 2017-18 before you. While the report has its central focus on highlighting the significant engagement of the Institute during the period concerned, it mirrors current development narratives that were central to the debate and discussion in the academic programmes Institute launched. The underlying concern was, as has always been, the quest for an alternative development paradigm that can help humankind to emancipate from impoverishment, growing economic inequality and social differentiation. The Development Dialogue on "Malnutrition among children and women in Bihar" was one such programme that had significant bearing on reconstruction of the extant development paradigm being followed. The dialogue which was organized based on a painstaking study conducted by the Institute in the state of Bihar raised the fundamental question as to why economic



development failed to address growing incidence of malnutrition among children and women. The deliberations being made by eminent scholars, representatives from the civil society organizations and concerned government officials had invaluable contribution towards enriching the content of the programme. The rising income inequality and its disastrous implications for democracy leading to deepen world economic crisis was echoed in A. N. Sinha Memorial lecture on 'A Climacteric for Capitalism'. It was restructuring of the contemporary world capitalism under globalization that contributed significantly to such crisis. Hence, economic transformation which was sought but rooted in the contemporary global capitalism was challenged. The debatable issue was that the neo-liberal regime reached a dead-end, and, hence, how to reconstruct the development paradigm. In another occasion, ANSISS witnessed critical reflections on the current development narratives of India with respect to its devastating socio-political scenario. It was argued how democracy was threatened by the persistent decline of social cohesion and cultural pluralism in the context of India. This issue was brought to the centre in the Foundation Day lecture organized by the Institute on "Cultural Pluralism, social cohesion and Development in the context of India Today" The lesson that one learnt from the deliberation was that when the nation state had fallen short of critical minimum fraternity and cohesion among its citizen with the expanding social base of democracy no sustainable inclusive development was possible to achieve. In addition to all these intellectual engagements, ANSISS could organize orientation -cum-training programme on Methodological approach towards gender studies. What was heartening to note was that the programme could attract a large number of participants from different parts of the country including Maharashtra, Gujrat, Himachal Pradesh, Odisha, West Bengal, Uttar Pradesh and Bihar. The Institute was proud of having its workstation opened for research on sample Micro-data from Census.

The significant aspect of all these activities is that the proceedings of all these programmes are published and disseminated to all concerned. Besides, Institute is now regularly bringing out its Newsletter (biannually), monograph series and Journal.

The contribution of the faculty members towards research, presentation of seminar and writing papers in reputed journals was immense for the Institute to take a step forward. As many as 18 research projects were completed, 20 research projects were on-going. The number of the proposed research projects during this year was 45. Besides, 33 research papers were published in the peer reviewed journals in addition to chapters in edited volumes and monographs. The participation of the faculty members in seminar, conference, consultation etc and presentation of papers was remarkably high. The internal seminar series presented by the faculty members was no less important. While no room was left to be complacent with the achievement, faculty members were equally conscious about the quality of the research both in terms of its form and content to leave an indelible impact in the realm of creativity. The contribution of the doctoral students to the annual research corpus was also of considerable significance.

At ANSISS we continue to pool our resources not only from the government of Bihar and ICSSR but also from other sources so that financial hardship cannot deflect the Institute from its objective of achieving excellence in the creative world of knowledge. In the face of multiple challenges, I seek your support in our endeayour to achieve the same.

About The Institute

Anugraha Narayan Sinha Institute of Social Studies was established by the Government of Bihar, in the fond memory of Dr. Anugraha Narayan Sinha (18 June 1887 to 5 July 1957). Dr. Sinha was an Indian statesman and ardent follower of Mahatma Gandhi since the days of Champaran Satyagraha Movement, also, first Deputy Chief Minister-cum-Finance Minister (1946-1957) and one of the architects of modern Bihar. The Institute was inaugurated on January 31, 1958, by 'Desh Ratna' Dr. Rajendra Prasad, the first President of India. Later it was made a statutory autonomous body through legislation of The Bihar Gazette (EXT) on the October 8, 1964, under the Anugraha Narayan Sinha Institute of Social Studies Act 1964, by the Government of Bihar. The Institute is governed by the Board of Control and funded by the Department of Education, Government of Bihar and Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), New Delhi through Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Government of India.

The purpose and powers of the Institute as laid down in the ANSISS Act, 1964 are:

- To undertake teaching and research in Social Sciences;
- 2. To undertake study of specific problems, as and when required by the State Government or the Central Government or any other agency;
- To provide training and research facilities in social, economic and administrative problems; 3.
- To publish journals, books, pamphlets, brochures, and other materials as may be deemed necessary; 4.
- 5. To organise lectures, seminars, and conferences, and
- 6. To undertake other allied activities.

Research Area

The research theme of the Institute broadly focuses on development and change, with special reference to Bihar. Efforts have usually been made towards studying the mechanisms and processes of change in the wake of development, within appropriate theoretical and conceptual framework. Issues and problems within above framework are identified and analyzed towards finding their solutions.

Accordingly, researches of theoretical and empirical nature are broadly diagnostic, evaluative, and prescriptive having had its relevance to the economy, society, and polity of the country in general and the state of Bihar, in particular. The aforesaid studies are conducted by the faculty members of the Institute. Special attention is paid to the study of the under-privileged and the rural poor, especially the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, women, and other socially and economically disadvantaged groups, within the disciplines of Economics, Sociology and Social Anthropology, Social Psychology, Political Science, Public Administration, Social Geography, and Non-Violence and Peace. The Institute has multi-disciplinary operational character and approach. Concerted efforts are made to take full advantage of the multi-disciplinary structure of faculty members at the Institute. While each discipline pursues its own research programme, there are number of research projects in which members from different disciplines come together to analyze the problems at hand with a common perspective so that an integrated view of the social reality could emerge. Over the years, there has been an appreciable expansion of activities at the Institute with a strong multi-disciplinary approach of the faculty members supported by research scholars

Today, it is one of the most prestigious social science research institute in India. Indian Council of Social Science Research, New Delhi has recognized it as the Centre of Excellence in the field of Social Science research. Several international organizations including UNICEF, World Bank, ILO, WHO, DFID, UNDP, etc., in addition to the State Government and the Government of India, offer research assignments to this Institute on priority basis. It is also considered as one of the most important research institute by the government. The Institute has acquired a high status in the scholastic world for its quality of academic output.

Campus and Resources

The Institute is located in a sprawling campus situated at the southern bank of the Ganga. It is just 2 kms from Patna Railway Junction at the North West end of Gandhi Maidan. Even though located in the heart of the city, it boasts of its picturesque location with quiet surroundings.





The Institute has a spacious three floor building having the Academic-cum-Administrative Complex. It houses the administrative office on the ground and the first floor. A three storey building for library and support office is attached to the main building. In addition to this, there is another three storey Hostel-cum-Guest House which provides accommodation to the Institute's doctoral fellows and visiting scholars.

Faculty and Staff Quarters

The Director and some senior members of the faculty have been provided with accommodation in the campus. Buildings are proposed to be constructed for the faculty members and supports staffs.

This campus has also been a part of the great heritage and freedom struggle. Mahatma Gandhi had visited Bihar before independence and had stayed in this campus from March 6, 1947 to May 24, 1947 (except 1-14 April), adjacent to the house of Dr Sayed Mahmood, the then Minister of the Government of Bihar (presently the Director's Bungalow).





Library

The ANSISS library started in January 1958. The first book "नेहरू अभिनन्दन ग्रन्थ" (Abhinandan Granth)", was accessioned by the library on April 16, 1958. The book was edited by Dr. Rajendra Prasad, First President of India, and Nehru Abhinandan Samiti and published by Aryavart Prakashan-Grih, Kalkatta (now Kolkata) in 1949 having 615 pages. The book mainly covered the life and work history of Jawaharlal Nehru. It also threw light on the Indian history.

The library is housed in its separate building of three floors. The second floor of the library was inaugurated on December 1, 2011 by Sri Nitish Kumar, Chief Minister of Bihar. The library of the institute claims to have outstanding collection of books, reports and journals in Social Sciences. Ex-Prime Minister of India, late Smt. Indira Gandhi, also paid a visit to this library on January 4, 1984; Silver Jubilee Celebration of this Institute.

During 2016-17, the library added 196 books and 63 reports and bound volumes of Indian and foreign journals. The institute presently subscribes to 90 Indian and 53 foreign Journals and receives 23 journals in exchange.

The library also subscribes to some important national and foreign weeklies besides newspapers. At present, the library has 33311 books. In addition, there are 33026 bound volumes of journals and reports. The Library has also started Current Awareness Services





(CAS) of recent reports and publications of ANSISS. It provides a host of 'Users Oriented Services' such as Reference Services, e-Journals, Documents Delivery Services (DDS), Institute's News Services (INS), Seminar Alerts, Bibliographic Service and e-Library Services.

ANSISS library has access to most of the databases of Social Studies. New books and reports of the library are powered by e-Granthalaya. Library has extended facility for free access to e-resources from NASSDOC-

ICSSR. Students can access full text journals titles from the following databases apart from subscribed e-journals on Statics IP address. The databases are -

- Online EPW
- EconLit (EBSCO)
- **JSTOR**
- India Stat and Prowess

Besides, there are CDs in the stock as well. Many institutions including ICSSR, New Delhi and individuals have been sending complementary copies of their publications to this library. Various Government agencies, State Assembly, UNESCO and ILO regularly send their reports and publications.

The library has also received personal collection of Lok Nayak Jayprakash Narayan (JP) as a gift from him. The collection consists of nearly 3,000 books on wide range of subjects. All of it has been kept under separate section known as the "JP Collection". The institute's library has been designated as one of the Depository Libraries in India by International Organisations like UNCTAD and UNESCO.

Computer Centre

The Institute has a full-fledged computer lab, equipped with more than 25 computers with high speed internet access having NKN support. The computer lab has been developed to enable the Doctoral fellows to have an adequate exposure to computer based research tools and access to research and development networks across the globe. With support from ICSSR, the researchers at the institute have begun to access some of the key e-resources.



Advanced statistical software is also accessible on case basis. However it is in consideration for unrestricted availability. The lab is also being used by the project staffs who are working under different research projects of the institute.

Seminar and Conference Halls

The Institute has a large air conditioned conference hall and three well-furnished seminar halls with comfortable seating arrangements. The conference hall has the capacity of accommodating 220 people, where conferences, seminars and public lectures are held generally.

The seminar halls are of medium and small sizes with seating capacity of 80 and 35 people respectively. They are used for orientation and training programmes, workshops, academic debates, discussions, meetings of the Board of Control, etc. In addition to these air-conditioned Conference and Seminar Halls, the Institute has an Open Hall on the second floor of the building, having a capacity to accommodate 80-100 persons, which is generally used for training, workshops, and other miscellaneous purposes.

Workstation for Research on Sample Micro-data from Census

A Workstation for Research on Sample Micro-data from Census has been setup at the Institute with support from the office of the Registrar General of India, Ministry of Home Affairs, GoI New Delhi and the ICSSR New Delhi. Dr. Sudhir Kumar, HoD, Division of Statistics at the Institute has been made Nodal Officer and takes care in providing the required services pertaining to Census Micro-data and analysis for the researchers on requisition. Sri Krishna Nandan Prasad Verma, Hon'ble Minister,



Department of Education, Government of Bihar-cum-Chairman A N Sinha Institute of Social Studies, Patna inaugurated the Census-Workstation on November 8, 2017. It is a unique and very important facility in the sense that it will be very helpful to all researchers of this part of the country.

Hostel and Guest House

The Institute has a good quality hostel-cum-guest house, which serves dual purpose of guest house for the visiting scholars and hostel for the ICSSR Doctoral Fellows. It is a three-storied building with single and double rooms, lounge and mess facilities. There is also a newly constructed guest house, named after Late Shri Madhu Limaye, famous Indian Socialist Parliamentarian, separately.





Health Centre

The Institute has now an in-house health centre facility for all members of the institute. There is provision of a doctor to provide medical treatment to the members of the institute on weekly basis.



Academic Divisions/ Centres

Division of Economics and Agriculture Economics

This division largely relates to micro and macro development: sectoral and spatial, agriculture, land reforms, political economy of development, poverty, institutional and infrastructural questions along with poverty, livelihood, nutrition, education, natural resource management, irrigation and water management, employment and labour, human development, and welfare programmes etc. The dynamics of rural economy is being probed in all its diversities with special reference to the state of Bihar. A number of research projects have been taken up on these themes.

Division of Sociology and Social Anthropology

The research interest of this Division lies in the exploration of culture of poverty with special reference to SC and ST and in ascertaining the role of women and their status in society. Similarly, the impact of changing technology, industrialization, rural development and developmental planning on social structures receive attention of the faculty members of Sociology. Now the faculty members have developed experience and expertise in formulating, enacting, monitoring and evaluating various welfare and development programmes of the government in the area of health, nutrition, children, women and other target groups. Problems of distributive justice, education and social stratifications constitute other important strand of research priority.

Division of Political Science and Public Administration

This Division is devoted to the explanation of political progress and political dynamics especially in the state of Bihar. The research themes include political parties, pressure groups, movements, leadership, state politics, politics at grassroots, electoral processes, politics and stratification, politics among the weaker sections and violence. It also provides objective analysis of planning and implementation of government programmes, with respect to agriculture, health, education and welfare. Special emphasis is placed on administration in the district, block and Panchayat levels with a view to suggest improvement in planning, coordination, supervision and execution of various programmes. Voluntary organizations are important areas of enquiry and receive considerable attention from our faculty members. The faculty also specializes in the study of PRI, human rights, particularly child rights protection, child labour, bonded labour etc.

Division of Social Psychology

This division focuses on socio-psychological research on social issues and problems of maintaining social harmony, peace, mental health, physical health and achieving well being and happiness of individuals, society and nation. Some studies have been focused on group behaviour, leadership, social power, student activism, child rearing practices, socio-psychological problems in school education, quality of working life, mental health of adolescents, disability and rehabilitation of children, religiosity and secularism, gender issues, attitude towards dowry etc. Other research areas of the division are social security and old age, family dynamics, youth among marginal sections, malnutrition and children behaviour, food crisis and other issues of public health, climate change and human behaviour, conflict resolution and peace psychology, female foeticide etc.

Division of Statistics

Division of Statistics has a multifarious role in social science research. It intends to provide technical support to other divisions and faculty members of the institute in data management along with providing training in Research Methods. It has been involved in various socially relevant training and research activities in the area of Decentralized Planning, Disaster Management, Non-conventional energy uses, Adult Education/Literacy, Primary Education, Vulnerability of the society in relation to transmission of HIV/AIDS, Agro-Forestry, Perspective Planning, Poverty Measurement, Panchayati Raj Institutions, Voter Behaviour, Border Area Development, etc.

Research Centers

The need for setting up some specialized centers has been felt since long, where it would be possible to conduct multi-disciplinary research in a comprehensive, longitudinal and cross-sectional frame. The idea of having specialized centers emerged out of the concern for the complex nature of profoundly intertwined economy and social problems of the country. There is an immense need of making a multipronged, collaborative attempt by faculties from different disciplines. Setting up such centers, therefore, is a prerequisite to accomplish the task in view.

Centre for Non-Violence and Peace (CNVP)

This institute has been pursuing its research agenda in the direction of liberation of humanity from feudal exploitation, agrarian violence, social discrimination and injustices, based on glorious heritage of Buddha, Mahavira and Gandhi, who contributed rare learning and knowledge. In order to take up thematically focused task of research, teaching and training with contemporary relevance, the Institute has established this Centre which justifies the legacy of great heritage of non-violence. Basic objectives of this center are to analyze the ground reality and contribute towards knowledge generation in the field of non-violence and peace by comprehension of structural contradictions, conflicts and violence in the society, economy and polity towards refinement of concepts and development of theories of non-violence and peace with contextual contemporary concerns, and to promote research, teaching and training.

Centre of Social Geography (CSG)

Basic objectives of this Centre are to identify several contemporary social inequalities from geographical perspectives; to explain and critique the economic, political and cultural processes that create and sustain social and spatial inequalities; and promote an awareness of social inequalities, affecting the everyday geography of people. In other words Social Geography is primarily concerned with the ways in which social relations, identities and inequalities are created with reference to spatial dimensions and its role in defining and distinguishing between sociology and social geography. The division draws upon political, economic, and cultural fields of geography, but the emphasis remains on social issues affecting people's lives - class, race/ethnicity, gender, poverty, body, health and well-being - and the role of space in creation of social inequality and oppression, particularly in Indian context.

EBSCO also provides e-books and audio-books across a wide range of subject matter. ECONLIT EBSCO is provided free of cost by ICSSR, New Delhi to all its constituent research institutes. Econlit is a widely used online database and very useful in citation too. Mr. Rai Kumar Mahapatro was the Training Specialist from EBSCO.

Panel discussion on State, Market and Gandhian Ethics Coordinator: Dr. Bipul Kumar

A. N. Sinha Institute of Social Studies organized a Panel Discussion as part of commemorating the centenary celebration of Champaran Satyagraha on 'State, Market and Gandhian Ethics' on 29th July, 2017. Prof. Sudarshan Iyengar, former Vice-Chancellor, Gujarat Vidyapeeth, Gujarat and Prof. N. Radhakrishnan, Chairman, Indian Council of Gandhian Studies, New Delhi deliberated on the issue. Welcome address was given by Prof. Dr. Sunil Ray, Director ANSISS.



Sudarshan Iyengar argued that for Gandhi economic system is a sub system of human society consisting of many other systems where economic behaviour is one part and there is social and moral behaviour as well. Gandhi rejects the 'economic man'; for him the dominant part of the human behaviour has to be the moral behavioural. For Gandhi it is 'moral man' who should be entering into economic behaviour. Market failure introduced the role of state in guiding economic activities. However, even the state apparatus works under the assumption that economics is value neutral. In fact, there are serious setbacks even on economic front both in the state run economies and the marker driven. Gandhi argues that self-regulated individuals have better scope of building harmonious and sustainable societies

Prof. N. Radhakrishnan lamented that by 'growth', what is meant today is economic growth and man has all of a sudden been reduced to the level of a commodity. Never before in human history is everything being measured in terms of per capita income or GNP or the relative purchasing power or such other material considerations. Markets with the connivance of the State calls the tune. Moral values, ethics, spirituality, family values, religious insights have all seemed to have lost their place in the emerging global scenario. In this context the legacy of Gandhi, particularly the holistic vision of Gandhi is of paramount importance. Gandhian principles reflect profound understanding of a revolutionary thinker, philosopher activist,



whose vision in life was steeped in pragmatism, love, compassion and change with consent.

Orientation-cum-Training on Methodological approach towards Gender Studies

Anugraha Narayan Sinha Memorial Lecture

Anugraha Narayan Sinha Memorial Lecture was delivered by the Prof. Prabhat Patnaik, Professor Emeritus, Jawahar Lal Nehru University, New Delhi on A Climacteric for Capitalism. Renowned Scholar Prof. Prabhat Patnaik (Professor Emeritus, Jawarhar Lal Nehru University, New Delhi) delivered the Anugraha Narayan Sinha Memorial Lecture (for the year 2017) on "A Climacteric For Capitalism" on 22 July, 2017.

Dr. Sunil Ray, Director, A. N. Sinha Institute of Social Studies, Patna welcomed the participants on the occasion of memorial lecture.

Prof. Prabhat Patnaik remembered contributions of Dr. A. N. Sinha as an outstanding freedom fighter, an architect of modern Bihar, and a staunch opponent of imperialism. Speaking on state of contemporary capitalism Prof. Patnaik argued that neo-liberal capitalism as we have known it until now having reached a dead-end and the pressing question before





mankind today is: what can be put in its place? The world economic crisis which began in 2008 continues unabated. The persistence of the world economic crisis which has now been spreading even to countries like India and China that initially appeared to have escaped it, can be attributed to the fact that it is rooted in certain structural changes in world capitalism that have occurred in the current period of globalization. It has for the first time in the history of capitalism led to a significant relocation of activities from the north to the south through the agency of metropolitan capital. Neo-liberal capitalism, even before the crisis, had entailed a major shift in income distribution away from the workers towards the surplus-earners in metropolitan economies. The social gulf between the workers and these groups has widened in the advanced countries under neo-liberal capitalism. The increase in income inequality and its implications for democracy are matters of concern.

Prof. Patnaik said that exactly similar situation develops in third world economies too, where, significant petty production, including peasant agriculture, still exists. The squeeze on this sector owing to the withdrawal of support from the State and its exposure to encroachment from big business, entails a reduction of incomes of producers within it. The crisis makes the conditions of the workers in the advanced countries, and the working people as a whole in the third world countries even worse, and provides fertile ground for the growth of fascist and semi-fascist movements.

Two specific factors contribute to the growth of such tendencies, apart from the material deprivation that neoliberalism engender. One is the weakening of class organizations such as trade unions under the neo-liberal regime; second factor is the loss of moral credibility of the intelligentsia. World of media-persons, literati, and even academics, whose social distance from the working people widens under the neo-liberal regime, are perceived by the latter as beneficiaries from neo-liberalism and hence as part of the "establishment". The fact that all over the world, from the U.S. to Europe to India, fascist and semi-fascist forces are in the ascendancy is the outcome of this particular conjuncture.

Chief Guest of the occasion Sri Oamar Ahsan (Vice Chancellor, Magadh University) also addressed the audience. He paid his tributes to Sri Anugraha Narayan Sinha as a statesman, associate of Mahatma Gandhi and freedom fighter. Sri Anugraha Narayan Sinha's role as an institution builder will always be remembered. Nil Ratan, Professor and Registrar in Charge, ANSISS Patna presented vote of Thanks.

Foundation Day Lecture on Cultural Pluralism, Social Cohesion and Development (In the Context of India Today)

A. N. Sinha Institute of Social Studies, Patna celebrated its 60th Foundation Day on 31st January 2018. The Director of the institute Prof. Sunil Ray welcomed the Chief Guest Sri Sushil Kumar Modi, Hon'ble Deputy Chief

Minister and Finance Minister, and Sri Krishna Nandan Prasad Verma, Hon'ble Minister, Department of Education, Government of Bihar, Prof. Anand Kumar (Retired Professor JNU, New Delhi and Fellow, Indian Institute of Advance Studies, Shimla) delivered the Foundation Day Lecture on "Cultural Pluralism, Social Cohesion and Development in the Context of India Today". Sri Krishna Nandan Prasad Verma, Hon'ble Minister, Department of Education, Government of Bihar presided over the occasion.



Prof. Anand Kumar presented his thoughts on the realities of cultural plurality, demands of social cohesion and imperatives of development in the context of India and its people in the 21st century world-system that contains

trajectories of religious nationalism, linguistic nationalism, and secessionism. He argued that twin issues of sustaining cultural pluralism and strengthening democratic ways of social cohesion and sustainable inclusive development are intimately related. The social base of democracy is expanding but there is shrinking of space for effective role of the marginalizing groups and communities. Any democratic nation-state must avoid discrimination, deprivation, and destitution to maintain critical minimum fraternity and cohesion among its citizens.



However, as challenges of social cohesion, Prof. Kumar drew attention towards linguistic nationalisms, alienation of ethnic communities and competitive communalism. He suggested that historically inherited social reality of cultural pluralism needs to be coordinated within the democratic discourse of social cohesion by recognizing the relative significance of four factors namely, language, religion, caste system and class relations. He argued that concerned citizenship can create peoples' pressure, particularly from aspirational younger Indians who are the new majority of our republic, to persuade the political class for steps for reforming our election system. It is the first basic reform which can create capacity in the political class to build three new compacts for harmonious and holistic development of our nation - i. economy and ecology, ii. Education and empowerment, and iii. Principles and politics.

The PhD programme lays emphasis on different dimensions of Social Sciences so as to equip the PhD students with an integrated framework within which various developmental and changing issues can be addressed. The programme is designed to develop issue based, inter-disciplinary, and applied as well as pure research orientation among the students so that they can understand the local, regional, national and international problems. It involves successful completion of six months pre-PhD course-work, consisting of Research Methodology and Core Subject, followed by submission of synopsis and formal registration in PhD programme. PhD Course is affiliated to the Aryabhatta Knowledge University (AKU), Patna.


Pre-PhD Course Structure and Duration

The main purpose of pre-PhD course work is to encourage fundamental research aptitude among research scholars through systemic training in computer aided research methodology and interactions with contemporary social science debates. The underlying intent is to prepare the students for theoretical rigour as well as applied understanding. At the end of the course the students are expected to be familiar with review of literature, designing and developing their own research and locate it in the on-going discourse of their areas.

Pre-PhD course has been structured as per the guidelines of UGC. Students are required to undertake three papers (two compulsory papers - research methodology and computer application/data analysis; and one elective paper from their subject) which are to be completed within six months. Evaluation of this course will be done through a written examination, followed by an internal assessment through presentations by the students.

Fellowship

Institute offers ICSSR supported Doctoral fellowship. The fellowship is offered preferably in the subjects of: Economics, Agriculture Economics, Sociology, Social Anthropology, Political Science, Public Administration, Social Psychology, Social Geography and Non-violence and Peace Studies. The selection process involves a written test followed by an interview of short listed candidates with specified eligibility criteria. Women, minorities and candidates from educationally backward states are considered on priority basis.


