I. Accessibility of Secondary data

- Information Technology as a means
- Differential Data sources: Government agencies and organisations
- documentation plays a critical role in transferring information about data from data producers to secondary users.

II. What are secondary data?

- Secondary Data already produced by someone else
- Users are just receiver of the data

III. What is Documentation?

- Documentation refers to the materials along with data that provides accounts of the data.
- Documentation helpful in understanding and analysing data
- content and quality of documented data differ from one dataset to another.

Problems of objectivity in Social Research

Objectivity is the regulative ideal for Research

- precise
- Unbiased
- open to criticism

Meaning

basing conclusion on facts without any bias and value judgement

 conclusion should be independent of one's personal beliefs, likes dislikes and hopes.

 data and the inference drawn from their analysis must be free from bias and prejudices

Objectivity in Natural Sciences

- must be an agreed-on method for producing results
- must be replicable
- same result must occur regardless of time and space

Objectivity in Social Sciences

- judgments are subjective, being colored by actor's own experiences
- All propositions are contextual
- observations are socially embedded
- Researchers are influenced by the values

Goals for Social Science Research

value neutrality

Exclusion of:

- subjective views
- personal bias
- personal convictions when working as researchers

Steps for ensuring Objectivity

 social scientist should study "what ought to be" and "what is"

A social scientist should not advocate for a particular value

Need to train social scientists

REPORT WRITTING

As an art/skill

Research process

- 1. Planning for work
- 2. Continuous process
- 3. Adjustments
- 4. Write-up

REPORT (Write-up)

- A formal logical presentation of the research,
- Teleological in nature beginning to end.
- Report concerns
- a) Planning- an exercise in writing and presentation of detailed facts.
- b) Structuring- how information and material is organized.
- c) Form- format, layout, spelling, grammar, punctuation
- d) Style- the way one communicates.

Steps before a final write-up:

- A. Devoting time to write so as to achieve consistency
- B. Coverage of all elements
- C. Making appropriate adjustments and recognition of errors
- D. Step wise step drafting
- E. Clarity and logic

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- F. Writing should be such that a layman can understand
- G. Editing and Proof reading

What is a good report?

A good report should be one, which effectively conveys/communicates the audience what the outcome of the project is or what the researcher wants to say.
